# LET US GO TO ST. JOSEPH

In the Old Testament, Pharaoh ordered to his people, "Go to Joseph; do whatever he says to you" (Gen 41:55). In the same way, the Lord also tells us: "Ite ad Joseph! (Go to Joseph)," who is the foster father of Jesus Christ, the spouse of the Virgin Mary, the patron of the Universal Church, and our congregation.

# WHY DO WE NEED TO GO TO ST. JOSEPH?

Fr. George Boronat, the Prelature of Opus Dei from London, gives a beautiful description: "If you want to find Jesus, go to St. Joseph—he found him after three painful days; if you want to always be close to Jesus and Mary, go to St. Joseph—no one has ever been closer to them; if you want to pray, go to St. Joseph—he spent his life in dialogue with God. If you encounter difficulties, turn to St. Joseph—he knows everything about suffering. If you want to be obedient, chaste, generous, humble, joyful, sincere, holy... go to Joseph." These are the characteristics that made St. Joseph a holy and just man. For this reason, God entrusted him with the greatest treasures: Jesus and Mary. In fact, simple and humble people are God's best instruments for his Kingdom.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta had a statue of Saint Joseph under which she used to place a piece of paper with what she needed for her home and for her children. Almost all the benefactors invariably shared that they suddenly felt the need to donate to Mother Teresa. Therefore, when we are in need of God's providence, let us go to St. Joseph; he will certainly intercede for us.



Pray for us St. Joseph is the head of the Holy Family; he will always understand the difficulties and struggles of the family. He will not leave any family without rendering his helping hand. Don Guanella affirmed it, saying, "St. Joseph was chosen by the eternal Father to be the head of the Holy Family. Thus, the great saint, whom Jesus and Mary obeyed, must be enthroned in all the houses of the work."

# DON GUANELLA WENT TO ST. JOSEPH, THE PATRON OF THE UNIVERSAL **CHURCH**

Devotion to St. Joseph was born and developed in Don Louis Guanella from his childhood. Later it was transformed into his congregation permeating together with his mission. Therefore, the Guanellian family has its own deep roots of devotion to St. Joseph. On December 8, 1870, Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph, as the patron or protector of the Universal Church. St. Joseph was the protector of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Jesus Christ. What better patron can a Church have? However, when St. Joseph was announced as a patron of the Church, Don Guanella was at Savogno. He wanted to establish the devotion of St. Joseph at Sovongo. A few months later, in April 1871, he blessed the image of St. Joseph and placed it in the renovated parish church.

As a founder, Don Guanella named many of his houses in the name of St. Joseph. Included are the Pious Union of St. Joseph and the Basilica of St. Joseph at Trionfale in Rome.

# DON GUANELLA AND PIOUS UNION OF ST. JOSEPH

Pope St. Pius X, another devotee of St. Joseph and admirer of Guanella's mission, supported Don Guanella generously in every way possible for the construction of the Basilica of St. Joseph. On March 19, 1912, UNION

Don Guanella inaugurated the basilica by celebrating the first mass. After the construction and the inauguration of the basilica of St. Joseph, he wrote to his religious men and nuns that he had made a vow to St. Joseph, that of erecting a pious union in his honour to help the dying with prayer. As St. Joseph is the patron of the dying and of a happy death, Fr. Guanella began the Pious Union of St. Joseph in 1913. It has two main purposes. The first one is to promote and spread the devotion of St. Joseph. And secondly,

it is to bind together as many priests and faithful as possible for the prayer and good works for a holy and happy death of the dying.

St. Joseph lived like all of us between joys and sorrows. We always have something to learn from his pure heart to fulfill God's plan. Hence, let us go to St. Joseph to imitate his footsteps, as Pope Francis writes, "St. Joseph teaches that, in the midst of the storms of life, we must not be afraid to leave to God the helm of our boat.". It is also proper to pray to St. Joseph for the good health of Our Holy Father Pope Francis.

As we begin the season of Lent, I would like to conclude with the message of Pope Francis, "Let us journey together in hope." While reflecting and participating in the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, make an inward journey that results in personal conversion, fraternal love, and hope. I wish you a blessed and fruitful Lent.

# Dear confreres,

I am spending a few days in our Founder's birthplace, to share the experience of contemplation carried on by some confreres here since February 2. These are useful days both for my spiritual life in the Lenten Season close at hand, and for sharing life with the confreres supporting their period of discernment.

# Let us journey Together In Hope

These are the three steps of the Lenten Message of Pope Francis.

**To journey**: We should not remain still, unmovable in our acquired position in our relationship both with God and with our brethren. We should foster the desire to come out of some situations that prevent us from giving authentic witness to Christ Resurrection. Let us give up our criticism on our community, our Church, our world, our Congregation, enveloping our life with a pessimistic vision. The Pope is asking us: *Am I really on a journey ... or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone?* 

**Together**: How important is, also for us confreres and for our communities, this fraternal synodality. The attitude to bear each other burdens overcoming





indifference, superficiality, lack of interest often perceived in our community life. Our 21<sup>st</sup> Chapter gave us as a challenge or a sign the value of fraternity to be constructed in our communities. How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity! The Pope is asking us: *are we capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs?* 

**In hope**: "With God all things are possible", was proclaimed as conclusion of today's Gospel reading, opening the new week. Let us be optimistic and overcome with determination situations that try to keep us fixed and tied to a past that often made our speech and action dim. For this Holy Year the theme setting the tune to our journey is **Pilgrims of hope!** The Pope is telling us: *do I concretely experience the hope... in such a way that no one feels excluded?* Yes, the hope that never deceives! How beautiful it is, to be consecrated persons, priests, confreres full of serenity and not gloomy, carrying to our communities the gift of our internal peace, our trust in Providence that will never abandon us, our joy of living together because we are brothers!

I entrust each and every community of our Congregation to the prayers of these confreres who are now living this contemplative experience in the Founder's House.

## INTER-COUNCIL MEETING FOR THE GUANELLIAN FAMILY



The Inter Council Meeting commenced on February 23, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. at Guanella Preethi Nivas, Bangalore. The meeting was animated by Fr. Soosai Rathinam SdC, Vice General, Servants of Charity, the participants were Fr. R. Gnanaraj and his council (DPP), Sr. Mary and her council (DSMP), Mr. Dominic Tilak, Delegate for the General Council, Mr. Hubert, President of Guanellian Lay Movement and his council (GC).

Sr. Claudia, DSMP invoked the God's blessing by singing the Holy Spirit song, and Fr. Gnanaraj welcomed the participants. Mr. Hubert read from the 1910 regulations of the Servants of Charity. "The primary purpose of the Institute of the Servants of Charity is the sanctification of its members. Love the Lord your God with your whole heart, mind, and strength; it is the great and first commandment by Jesus. Love your neighbour as you love yourselves; it is the second commandment. May the Servants of Charity be willing to enrich themselves with virtue and holy love so that they may be able to share them with others in abundance."

# Reflection of Rev. Sr. Victoria Willam

She inspired us with the wisdom of Pope Francis, encouraging us to become stars of hope in others' lives, just like the Magi. Emphasizing the importance of love, she quoted "Omnibus Caritas" (Let love be the priority in all our relationships). She exhorted us to imitate Jesus by nourishing and sanctifying others with the oil of gladness, hope, love, and forgiveness. She reminded us that our unity, availability, charity, and promotion of human

dignity are essential in reaching out to others and making a positive impact on their lives.

# Address of the Rev. Fr. Soosai Rathinam, Vice General

He highlighted that the 21st General Chapter emphasizes our Charism as a blend of paternity and maternity. Our founder envisioned the Guanellian family united under one umbrella. Many fathers and sisters have selflessly dedicated their lives, some even sacrificing their health and dying at a young age. Despite our differences in mindset among the SDC, DSMP, and GC, we must focus on unity in diversity. We should adopt a prophetic vision, thinking "globally and acting locally."

He emphasized that God is our Father, and we are all sons and daughters of the same loving Father, who cares deeply for our needy brethren. In a significant gesture of unity, the General Councils of both the Servants of Charity (SDC) and the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence (DSMP) signed the "Cartha de Communion" document, which emphasizes the bond of charity, the principle of affinity, open dialogue between the two branches, sharing joys and sorrows as a family, joint ventures and collaborations, prophetic challenges that inspire us to live together, and celebrating together as one family.

Following the sharing of the fathers, sisters, and Guanellian Cooperators, the following proposals were emphasized:

- **1. Vocation Promotion:** Focus on promoting vocations for the Guanellian Family.
- 2. Collaboration: Foster collaboration in three key areas:
  - Collaboration in Formation,
  - Collaboration in Mission and
  - Collaboration in Celebration.

# 3. Digital Presence:

- Create a website for the Guanellian Family.
- Establish a WhatsApp group for inter-council communication.

# 4. Regular Meetings:

- Convene inter-council meetings every six months.
- Next Inter-Council meeting will be held on November 9, 2025.

# 5. Jubilee Year Celebrations for the Guanellian Family

- DPP will organize a Eucharistic celebration on June 21, 2025, in Chennai.
- DSMP will organize Holy Rosary in three states on November 12, 2025.
- GC will organize pilgrimages in each state during a convenient season.

The program successfully promoted health awareness while fostering positive engagement among students, residents, and staff.

#### NAYANA EYE CAMP

**BANGALORE:** The Department of Social Work, Kristu Jayanti College, in collaboration with the Jayantian Extension Service and Narayana Nethralaya,
