My dear Confreres!

Advent represents a profound season of hope, extending beyond the anticipation of Christmas gifts. It is fundamentally a time of awaiting God's arrival. While we often discuss Advent as a period of preparation for the birth of Jesus, it is important to recognize that His birth was an unexpected event for the world at that time. Most individuals were largely unaware of its significance; the birth of Jesus did not capture public attention. The primary individuals who acknowledged this momentous occasion were His parents, a handful of shepherds, a few wise men, and, of course, the vast assembly of angels from the heavenly realm.

What people possessed during that era was hope. They were uncertain about the how and when, yet they firmly believed that God would enact something remarkable and extraordinary. They held onto the conviction that God cared for them, that He would not abandon them, and that assistance would come in some form. The prophetic words of Isaiah, penned centuries prior to Jesus' birth, served as a guiding light of hope for generations. These words provided solace during times of exile, poverty, and oppression, and were recalled after their nation faced invasion and defeat.

Hope can be likened to a hidden candle, illuminating the darkness. It is the anchor we cling to when all else seems lost. Hope embodies the remembrance of God's past deeds and the belief that He is capable of performing great wonders once more. The Christmas Eve of 2024 is going to be a special year. The papal bull, titled "Spes Non Confudit", meaning "Hope Does Not Disappoint," declared that the Jubilee Year will officially begin with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve 2024 and will officially conclude with the closing of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica on Jan. 6, 2026, on the solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord.

Pope Francis wrote in the papal bull, "May the Jubilee be a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' (cf. Jn 10:7,9) of our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere, and to all as 'our hope' (1 Tim 1:1)". He concluded the Bull with a final note of hope, praying that "the



coming Jubilee will be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God"; and that it might help us recover "the confident trust we require in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation." Holy Father has invited the Dioceses, Parishes and the Faithful to celebrate the jubilee year in the possible ways and so our Congregation has come with a module to celebrate the jubilee year as a Guanellian Family in three stages that you will find in the following pages.

We let ourselves be the constant incarnation of Jesus Christ in the flesh for the life of the world. As Saint Teresa of Avila said,

"Christ has no body but yours.

No hands, no feet on earth but yours.

Yours are the eyes through which He looks compassion on this world.

Yours are the feet with which He walks to do good.

Yours are the hands through which He blesses all the world.

Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body.

Christ has no body now on earth but yours."

Let me greet you during this very season of Advent a blessed preparation for the gift of Christ and year of Jubilee. Empty yourselves and Hope in the God, the Emmanuel, the God who is with us! My blessed greetings also of the Merriest Christmas to all our communities, to your families, to your loved ones and your friends.

What sublime thoughts this event so close to us is a source of; how many consolations is it cause for us... the time of God's greatest mercy! S.L.G.

Dearest Sisters, Brothers, and Cooperators,

Don Guanella wrote these words in "La Divina Provvidenza" as the Jubilee of 1900 approached: today we can repeat them too. The Holy Year that is about to begin is another great gift that the Lord, through His Church, offers to each of us and to all humanity: a time of consolation, of renewal, and of hope.

Pope Francis writes in the Bull of Indiction of the Ordinary Jubilee of the year 2025:

"Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt...."

May the Jubilee be an opportunity for everyone to revive hope!

May the Lord help us so that we too can reinvigorate our commitment to be women and men who sow hope "to exercise a beneficial influence on the believing and unbelieving world and to animate it to faith in God and charity towards our neighbor" (Vol. IV p. 329) as Don Guanella desired. Surely, we need to "abound in hope" (cf. Rom 15:13), so that we may bear credible and attractive witness to the faith and love that dwell in our hearts; that our faith may be joyful and our charity enthusiastic.

As a Guanellian Family we want to participate fully in this ecclesial event that brings with it an extraordinary outpouring of the Father's mercy.



You will all have had the opportunity to begin to look at the celebrations planned at the universal and diocesan level, we urge you to organize yourself as best as possible at the level of Circumscriptions, Delegation, Province and local realities, to participate and to have the Guests of our Houses and Services participate. As a sign of communion, we wanted to outline a small "Guanellian" path that will make us feel united even though we are scattered across five continents, overcoming, in prayer, all distances and differences.

Three stages are offered to walk together in this Holy Year: we "meet" on some dates, through subsidiaries of common animation developed by the Commission constituted and composed of the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence, the Servants of Charity and the Guanellian Cooperators.

TIME OF PREPARATION: DECEMBER 19, 2024

A few days after the opening of the Holy Year, in memory of the birth of our Holy Founder, an Intercontinental Eucharistic Celebration should be organized in the various realities (local, or by zones, or by Province) at the most appropriate time to encourage everyone's participation.

TIME OF CELEBRATION: JUNE 21, 2025

At the heart of the Holy Year, on the name day of Don Luigi Guanella, a Jubilee Day for the entire Guanellian family is planned. The location and time of the celebration can be identified at the provincial level or by gathering as Guanellian realities of the same territory, at a sacred Jubilee place.

MOMENT OF THANKSGIVING: NOVEMBER 12, 2025

Towards the end of the Holy Year, on the solemnity of Mary, Mother of Providence, participation in the Holy Rosary transmitted online, at the most suitable time, from a Church or a Guanellian House chosen together by the Superiors of the DSMP, the SdC and the GC in each Nation.

TWO OTHER OPPORTUNITIES ARE PROPOSED TO ENRICH OUR JOURNEY IN COMMUNION:



Dear brothers and sisters!

All of us, as the Apostle Paul would say, hold the treasure of life in earthen vessels (cf. 2 Cor 4:7). The International Day of Persons with Disabilities invites us to recognize that our frailty in no way obscures "the light of the Gospel of the glory of Christ", but instead reveals that "its extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us" (2 Cor 4:4,7). Everyone, apart from any merit or distinction, has received the Gospel in its entirety and, with this, the joyful task of proclaiming it. "All of us are called to offer others an explicit witness to the saving love of the Lord, who despite our imperfections offers us his closeness, his word and his strength, and gives meaning to our lives" (Evangelii Gaudium, 121). Sharing the Gospel, in fact, is not a duty entrusted only to some, but an absolute necessity for all those who have encountered Jesus and enjoyed his friendship.

OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Trust in the Lord, the experience of his tender love and the comfort of his companionship, are not the privilege of a few, or the prerogative only of those who have received a lengthy and thorough formation. Rather, his mercy makes itself known in a particular way to those who, instead of trusting in themselves, feel called to abandon themselves to the Lord and to empathize with their brothers and sisters. This brings with it a wisdom that gradually increases our awareness of our limits and allows us to appreciate all the more God's loving decision to help us in our weakness. An awareness that frees us from sorrow and lament – even for good reason – and opens our hearts to praise. The joy that radiates from those who encounter Jesus and entrust their lives to him is no illusion or the fruit of naiveté; it is the power of his resurrection penetrating lives marked by fragility.

Truly, we can speak of a magisterium of fragility that, if heeded, would make our society more humane and fraternal, enabling all of us to understand that happiness is bread that is not eaten alone. How much would a better awareness of our need for one another help us to have less hostile relationships with those around us! And how much would the realization that entire peoples cannot save themselves prompt us to seek solutions to the senseless conflicts we are experiencing!

On this Day, we want to be mindful of the sufferings of all those women and men with disabilities who live in the midst of war, or have been themselves disabled as a result of warfare. How many people – in Ukraine and in other theatres of war – remain imprisoned by ongoing conflicts, without the possibility of escape? They need to be given special attention and their access to humanitarian aid facilitated in every possible way.

This magisterium of fragility is a charism by which you – dear sisters and brothers with disabilities – can enrich the Church. Your presence "may help transform the actual situations in which we live, making them more human and more welcoming. Without vulnerability, without limits, without obstacles to overcome, there would be no true humanity". [2] For this reason, I am pleased that the synodal journey is proving a favourable occasion to listen at last to your voices, and that an echo of your participation can be found in the preparatory document for the continental stage of the Synod. There we read that: "Numerous reports point to the lack of appropriate structures and ways of accompanying persons with disabilities, and call for new ways of welcoming their contribution and promoting their participation: in spite of its own teachings, the Church is in danger of imitating the way society casts them aside. The forms of discrimination listed – the lack of listening, the violation of the right to choose where and with whom to live, the denial of the sacraments, the accusation of witchcraft, abuse – and others, describe the culture of rejection towards persons with disabilities. They do not arise by chance, but have in common the same root: the idea that the lives of persons with disabilities are worth less than others". [3]

The Synod, above all by its invitation to journey together and to listen to one another, can help us understand how in the Church – also with regard to the disabled – there can be no us and them, but a single us, with Jesus Christ at the centre, where each person brings his or her own gifts and limitations. This awareness, founded on the fact that we are all part of the same vulnerable humanity assumed and sanctified by Christ, eliminates arbitrary distinctions and opens the door to the participation of each baptized member in the life of the Church. What is more, in those places where the Synod has been truly inclusive, it has permitted us to dispel deep-rooted prejudices. Encounter and fraternity break down the walls of misunderstanding and overcome discrimination; this is why I trust that every Christian community will be open to the presence of our brothers and sisters with disabilities, and ensure that they are always welcomed and fully included. We come to realize that we exist as an us and not a them whenever disability, whether temporary or due to natural aging, affects ourselves or someone for whom we care. Then we begin to look at reality with new eyes and we see the need to break down even those barriers that at first seemed insignificant. Nothing, however, can detract from our certainty that no disability – temporary, acquired or permanent – can change the fact that we are all children of the one Father and enjoy the same dignity. The Lord loves us all with the same tender, fatherly and unconditional love. Dear brothers and sisters, I thank you for the initiatives taking place on this International Day of Persons with Disabilities, and I accompany them with my prayers. I bless you all from my heart and ask you, please, to pray for me.

PSYCHO-SEXUAL INTEGRATION



CUDDALORE: During the semester holidays, Fr. Rector organized a three-day course for college-going brothers conducted by Dr. Sr. Violet Clamencia, FSJ, a renowned psychotherapist. The course focused on the topic of psycho-sexual integration, providing a deep and holistic understanding of sexuality as a divine gift from God. Sr. Violet explained that sexual energy is not merely biological, but a sacred force meant to give life and foster creativity in all creation. Addressing youth and seminarians' struggles, she provided practical insights and guidance to help navigate this sensitive dimension of their lives with clarity and maturity. The course offered them a genuine understanding of sexuality, empowering them to embrace their consecrated vocation wholeheartedly.

Following this enlightening course, the brothers embarked on a three-day retreat that deepened their spiritual journey. The retreat was centered on personal prayer and emphasizing that God is our ultimate and authentic partner in this religious lifestyle. It provided them with a profound opportunity to strengthen their bond with God, as prayer life is foundational for priestly formation.

Brothers were reminded that prayer is the key to overcoming distractions, fear of demands, anger with God, modern trends, and confusion between spiritual and



religious living. The retreat highlighted the importance of acknowledging and confessing their sins, amending our ways, and committing to a life of grace. This time of reflection and renewal rekindled their spiritual fervor and reaffirmed their dedication to their vocation.
