The *Assumption* OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Dear Confreres!

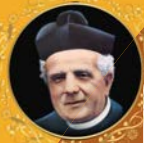
On 1 November 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly defined the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: ...by the authority of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.

**- Pope Pius XII, Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*
November 1, 1950.**

The essential point of this definition is that Mary was taken 'body and soul' into heaven when her earthly life had come to an end. What happened and how it happened is unknown. As with Jesus' resurrection, where no one saw him rise from the dead, there were no witnesses of the event of Mary's assumption. But that Jesus was raised in his body, and that Mary, too, shares in his victory in a bodily way is part of the Catholic faith. What the doctrine teaches is quite clear. Although the definition does not explicitly mention that Mary died; it can be safely presumed that she did. The dogma tells us that death was not the end for Mary. She has passed into a new form of life. She has reached the fulfillment of human perfection promised by Christ to those who follow him and do God's will. In other words, Mary is now alive and well and enjoying life with God.

What does the dogma of the Assumption of Mary also tell us? It is the Christian hope that there is life for all beyond the grave. Christians believe that death is not the end. They place their trust in Christ's promises that all will

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eventually join him in a resurrected life of glory and happiness in which death is no longer possible (cf. John 11:25- 26; 17:24). Mary is the living proof that these promises are not empty, that faith in Christ is well-founded.

Moreover, by emphasizing that Mary now enjoys a bodily life, the Church teaches that the body is an integral part of the person. So if there is to be a state of fulfilment which is the human destiny, it must include the body. Finally, it should be noted that belief in the assumption of Mary also affirms the essential goodness of the whole human person. The dogma of the assumption gives weight to the healthy appreciation of the body as an integral part of what it means to be a human being.

Assumption is nothing but the glorious reward of God to the Blessed Mother for the exemplary life she lived on earth with purity, obedience, and responsibility. May the assumed Mother intercede for each one of us to receive the same glory by following her virtues of purity, obedience, and responsibility.

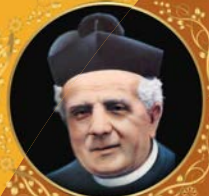

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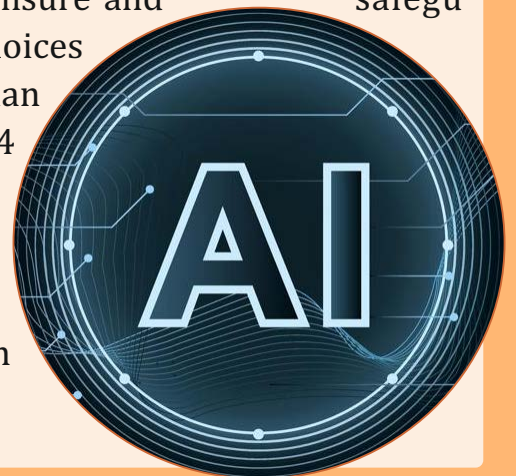

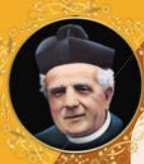
AI+Ethics

Dear friends, I send this greeting to those participating in the “AI Ethics for Peace” Gathering. Artificial intelligence and peace are two issues of supreme importance, as I had the opportunity to emphasize to the political leaders at the G7: “It should always be remembered that a machine can, in some ways and by these new methods, produce algorithmic choices. The machine makes a technical choice among several possibilities based either on well-defined criteria or on statistical inferences. Human beings, however, not only choose, but in their hearts are capable of deciding. A decision is what we might call a more strategic element of a choice and demands a practical evaluation. At times, frequently amid the difficult task of governing, we are called upon to make decisions that have consequences for many people. In this regard, human reflection has always spoken of wisdom, the phronesis of Greek philosophy and, at least in part, the wisdom of Sacred Scripture. Faced with the marvels of machines, which seem to know how to choose independently, we should be very clear that decision-making, even when we are confronted with its sometimes dramatic and urgent aspects, must always be left to the human person. We would condemn humanity to a future without hope if we took away people’s ability to make decisions about themselves and their lives, by dooming them to depend on the choices of machines. We need to ensure and safeguard a space for proper human control over the choices made by artificial intelligence programs: human dignity itself depends on it” (Address to the G7, 14 June 2024).

In commending your initiative, I ask you to show the world that we are united in asking for a proactive commitment to protect human dignity in this new era of machines.



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The fact that you are gathering in Hiroshima to discuss artificial intelligence and peace is of great symbolic importance. Among the current conflicts impacting our world – including the hatred of war – we hear more and more about this technology. That is why I consider this event in Hiroshima to be of extraordinary importance. It is crucial that, united as brothers and sisters, we remind the world that “in light of the tragedy that is armed conflict, it is urgent to reconsider the development and use of devices like the so-called ‘lethal autonomous weapons’ and ultimately ban their use. This starts from an effective and concrete commitment to introduce ever greater and proper human control. No machine should ever choose to take the life of a human being” (Address to the G7, 14 June 2024).

As we look at the complexity of the issues before us, recognizing the contribution of the cultural riches of peoples and religions in the regulation of artificial intelligence is key to the success of your commitment to the wise management of technological innovation.

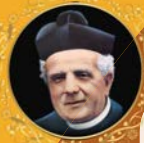
Hoping that your gathering will bear fruit in bringing about fraternity and cooperation, I pray that each of us may become instruments of peace for the world.

THE GRAND INAUGURATION





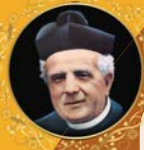

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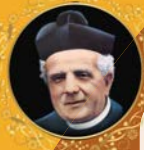


A DAY OF GRATITUDE

IT IS GOD WHO DOES



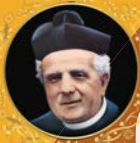

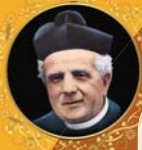

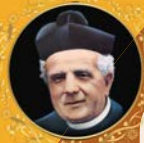
ROTARY'S HEARTWARMING GESTURE

THALAVADI: The best inheritance a parent can give their children is a few minutes of their time each day. On Sunday 7th July, the parent's meeting was arranged. Most of



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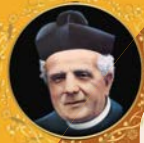

cultural activities. With the distribution of sweets to the students the program came to an end. With an auspicious start the students are expected to have a successful and rewarding academic year.

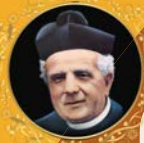
FEAST DAY

DONUTS AND DISCUSSIONS

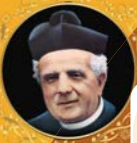

GARDEN GROWING

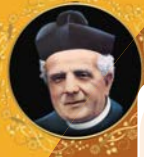

KITCHEN NEARING COMPLETION



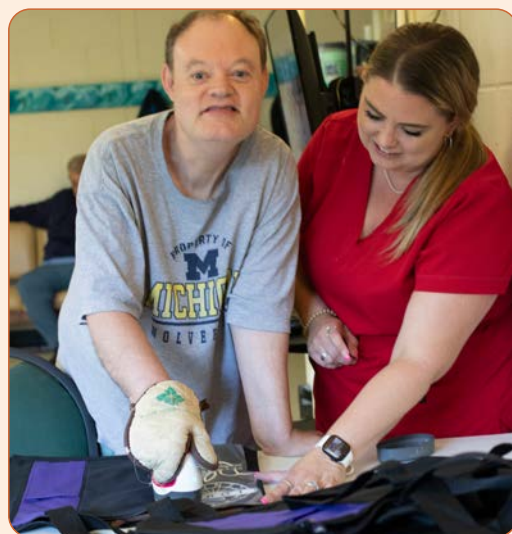

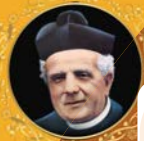
GOLF OUTING SEASON OFFICIALLY OPENED

GRADUATION FROM SACRED HEART SCHOOL

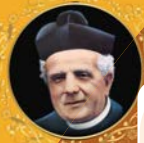
