Dear Confreres,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are invited to contemplate the profound mystery of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - Three Persons united in perfect communion, love, and oneness. The Holy Trinity is the eternal model of unity, mutual self-giving, harmony, and mission. In Their togetherness, humanity discovers the source of hope, fraternity, and Divine Providence. The marvellous works of the Triune God continue to inspire our consecrated life, our apostolic mission, and our communion as a Province.

The Father lovingly creates, the Son redeems with sacrificial love, and the Holy Spirit sanctifies and renews the face of the earth. This living communion of love calls each one of us to become instruments of unity, charity, and evangelization in today's wounded and fragmented world. As Servants of Charity, we are challenged to mirror in our communities the same spirit of communion and missionary zeal that flows from the Holy Trinity.

1. Magnifica Humanitas

Pope Leo XIV released his first major encyclical titled *Magnifica Humanitas* ("Magnificent Humanity") on May 25, 2026. The sweeping teaching document, which is subtitled *On Safeguarding the Human Person in the Time of Artificial Intelligence*, calls for AI to be disarmed from the logic of domination and urges technological progress to serve human dignity.

The Holy Father reminds humanity that technological advancement must always safeguard human dignity, moral responsibility, fraternity, and the sacredness of human relationships. Artificial Intelligence, while offering great possibilities for development and service, should never replace the human heart formed by compassion, conscience, and faith.

The Church invites us to discern wisely the opportunities and challenges presented by modern technology. As consecrated religious and missionaries, we are called not merely to adapt to changing times but to humanize them with Gospel values. Technology must remain at the service of the person, especially the poor, the vulnerable, and those who seek meaning, love, and spiritual accompaniment.

2. Renewal of Vows of the Temporary Professed Brothers

With profound joy and gratitude, we thank the Lord for the twelve temporary professed brothers who renewed their religious vows. Their renewal is a beautiful testimony that the Lord continues to call young hearts to follow Him in the spirit of charity and service.

3. First Religious Profession of Novice Jenish

With immense joy, the Divine Providence Province celebrates the First Religious Profession of Novice Jenish on 31st May 2026. This sacred moment marks the beginning of a new journey of consecrated life in the Guanellian family. A total of thirteen members, including one novice and two regents, took part in this spiritually enriching programme. The retreat was animated and guided by Rev. Fr. As individuals age, monitoring changes in weight plays an important role in maintaining overall health and wellness, yet without the right equipment, even a simple weigh-in can present challenges. The new wheelchair scale is now installed in the nursing office at Father Guanella Hall, where residents can be weighed safely, comfortably, and accurately. The equipment allows staff to better monitor residents' health, track important changes in wellness, and provide more attentive care for individuals with mobility challenges. On May 1st, Fr. David Stawasz demonstrated the new scale for Karen and thanked her for the thoughtful and practical gift. Her generosity will support residents for years to come by helping ensure they continue to receive compassionate, high-quality care.
